UPDATES TO THE HALTON-HAMILTON SOURCE PROTECTION PLAN

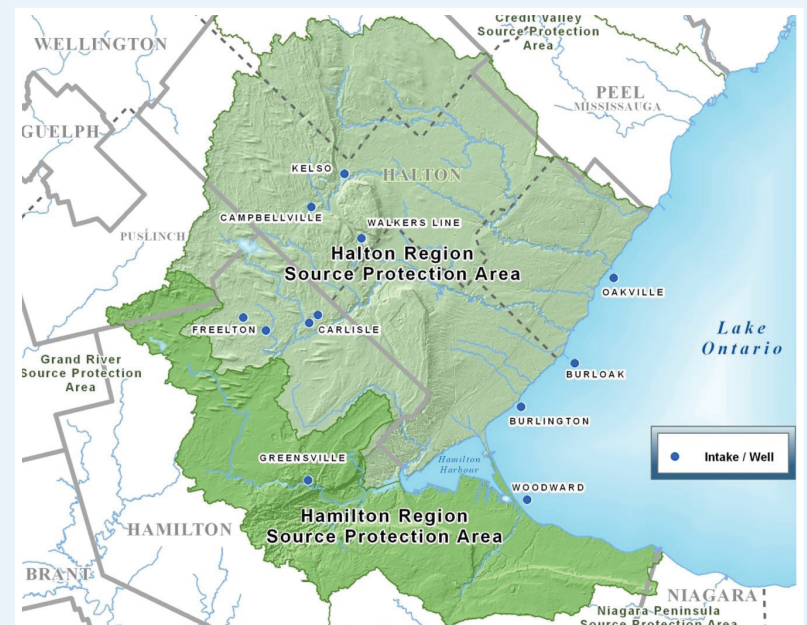
